This methodology change accounts for the large increase in expenditures between FY2001 and current reporting. For this reason, change in expenditures between FY2001 and present are not reported.

\*\*\* Rhode Island does not have a state psychiatric hospital. Reported figures are expenditures expended for psychiatric services at a state-run hospital (Eleanor Slater Hospital).
