Forensic Peer Bridger Training

What: Created a workforce innovation "a Forensic Peer Bridger Training & Internship opportunity"

 Recruitment of individuals living with mental illness and justice (criminal) involved histories

 Enhanced Workforce to include people in recovery as collaborators and partners



Forensic Peer Bridger Training

Why: Peers may be able to better meet the needs of others who have managed similar challenges

- Discharge Planning where peers assist in successful community integration
- Community Linkages of as needed natural supports and clinical services



Forensic Peer Bridger Training/Internship Where:

 Academic Campus for 42 hour weekly training program (19 out of 22 completed including 2 stopped

attending). Also

7 guests completed the training.



 State Psychiatric Hospital for 7 day 42 hour internship (5 completed, significant internship barriers)
